

This prayer was offered by Mr. Jeff Bivin as the Prayer of the People:

In 1902, Adelaide A. Pollard had hopes to go to Africa as a missionary. However she was unable to raise the necessary funds to make that journey. Discouraged and disheartened, she visited a prayer service where she found encouragement for her life from the verses in Jeremiah 18. When she returned home that evening, she wrote the words to what would become the hymn we know today as "Have Thine Own Way, Lord." It is my understanding that the Lord's plan for her life was to teach girls here in America at a missionary school.

This prayer is an adaption and extension of Adelaide Pollard's words that became the hymn "Have Thine Own Way, Lord."

Have Your own way, Lord! Have Your own way!

You are the Potter, we are your clay.

Mold us, make us, fill us and use us in accordance to your will.

Help us to wait patiently, quiet and still for you to work in us your own way.

Precious Savior divine, touch us, heal us, make us whole in our walk along the way.

Hold us in our weakness so that from the truth we may not sway.

Fill us with Your Spirit so that in our daily walk all shall see You and Your Glory.
