The Joyful Church

This month is declared a joyful month to remind us that we are a joyful church that rejoices in every circumstance of life! I love our church because it embodies joy, as evident in our Sunday gatherings and during any church activities. As Nehemiah 8:10 says, "For the joy of the Lord is our strength!" I am grateful to serve a church that is filled with joy.

This month's sermon series will focus on the nature of joy in light of our contemporary situation and how we can live joyfully in spite of...Did you know that joy is the birthright of every child of God? Every believer should experience a conscious, conspicuous, continuous, and contagious joy. Any Christian who does not live joyfully is missing out on the privileges that come with their faith. Numerous passages in the Bible support this idea. For instance, Isaiah 61 describes the joyful life that God desires for His followers. This joy is not dependent on our circumstances; rather, it is a state of mind characterized by peace and stability, even amid life's challenges. Do you possess this joy—true joy, everlasting joy?

As part of our sermon series on joy, **our virtual Bible study on Wednesdays from May 7 – June 11, 2025, will explore the Book of Nehemiah**. Nehemiah recounts the rebuilding of Jerusalem and its walls. We will specifically focus on the themes of restoration, reconciliation, and rebuilding, which are central to the redemptive story. Restoration, Reconciliation, Rebuilding—that was not just the plan for Nehemiah; it was not just the hope of the people at that time that God would restore, reconcile, and rebuild them. It's the hope of every human being who has ever drawn breath, hoping for reconciliation, restoration, and rebuilding. These teachings are particularly relevant as we navigate the current global situation.

On May 11th, we will celebrate and honor our mothers during the worship service. We will acknowledge them in all the roles God has blessed them with—biological, surrogate, adoptive, foster, and more. We will also honor the women for whom "mother" may not be a noun but certainly applies as a verb, as they have truly "mothered" children with their love. We invite you to bring your families and friends to share this special day with us.

We extend our special congratulations to our birthday and anniversary celebrants! We rejoice with them and pray that God continues to bless them with many happy and healthy years.

We continue to pray for our brothers and sisters experiencing health and other life challenges for healing and God's presence in their situations.

Let us always remember that "the joy of the Lord is our strength" (Nehemiah 8:10) in any situation!


SUMMER FUNDRAISERS

LIGHT OF HOPE

From inside the fish Jonah prayed to the Lord his God. He said: "In my distress I called to the Lord, and he answered me." ~Jonah 2:1-2

For several days now I have been feeling depressed—as if life is weighing me down, as if I can't breathe fresh air, as if I were at the bottom of the sea. Outwardly, I am all smiles, but inside I feel a knot in my chest. Still, deep within me I trust in God and God's plan. Though today it seems like I have run into a dead end, God's purpose will be fulfilled.

I believe it is important to share and speak of the difficult moments we endure as well as the joy of the miracles we receive. Every new morning signals an invitation for us to be grateful for at least one thing, to trust in God's promises and not to lose heart. After all, God protected Daniel in the lion's den, watched over Joseph when his brothers threw him into a well, and brought Jonah out of the great fish. Dark moments and distress will continue to test our faith, but we will be victorious when we remain anchored in our faith and seek God's light of hope.

Chompers

The Nile crocodile boasts the strongest jaws on earth.

Its chomp is 7 times more powerful than a great white shark's, and 15 times mightier than a Rottweiler's.

This African croc brings down wildebeests, zebras ... and people. Its jaws kill hundreds of people every year; very few humans survive a croc attack. In fact, crocodiles are considered the wild kingdom's most prolific predator of humans.

And yet...those same killer jaws cradle the croc's newly hatched babes. When the tiny crocs begin breaking out of their shells, the mother hears their "peeping," and unearths the nest. She might even help the 8-inch youngsters emerge by delicately rolling and squeezing the egg in her mouth until the shell breaks. Mama croc then loads the 24 hatchlings into her gaping jaws ~ lined with more than 5 dozen teeth ~ and gently transports them from the riverbank nest to the water nearby. There, she will protect her family for several months.

That croc's mouth holds the power of life and death.

Ours mouths have that power too: Words that build up or tear down ... Conversations filled with hope or discouragement ... Lips that praise God or curse Him. When you glide the morning toothbrush over your own "chompers," think of the Nile croc, and then utter King David's prayer, "Set a guard over my mouth, Lord; keep watch over the door of my lips." ~Psalm 141:3
