THE PASTOR'S PAGE**January 2026****How Deep is Your Root?**

A new year has arrived, and we give glory to God for allowing us to see it. As we look forward to the exciting adventures ahead, we must remember that what this year brings largely depends on what we bring to it. I wonder how we would respond to God's open offer to King Solomon when God asked him in 1 Kings 3:4, "Ask, what should I give you?" It's as if God was saying, "Solomon, you fill it out, and it's yours."

If you had the opportunity, what is one thing you would ask God to grant you in 2026? I encourage you to reflect on the hymn "Guide My Feet, While I Run This Race." As we journey together as people of faith, it's important to acknowledge the practices that help us navigate this path effectively. We have been on this journey for many years, and I urge everyone not to neglect these valuable practices that enable us to run this race well.

This month's sermon series will focus on the importance of being "Rooted" in our faith. Having deep roots in our beliefs is essential for weathering the various challenges that may arise, just as the early Christians faced difficulties. These challenges can include the devil's cunning tactics aimed at discouraging you from continuing on your journey.

Common questions might arise, such as: "You have been a member for a long time; what are you gaining from it?" or "Your church membership isn't increasing—why not find a larger church with more opportunities to serve and connect with others?" You may also hear, "How long will you stay in this church without young people?"

In this sermon series, we will explore the significance of tree roots and apply these lessons to our daily lives as Christians. We will encourage one another to reflect on our mission and consider how we can strengthen our relationships while attracting others to God's kingdom.

PLEASE NOTE

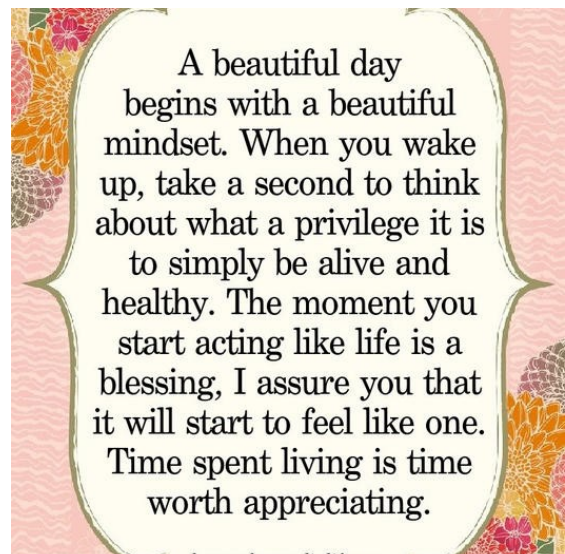
